THE WINELANDS

The Winelands are located in the western region of South Africa, and where you'll find more than 90% of South Africa's vineyards. The Atlantic Ocean's cooler breezes from the west partner with the

warm air that travels on the Indian Ocean's current from the east to create the same Mediterranean climate that produces fine wines around the world. A journey through the Winelands engages all of your senses – whether it's tasting the wines, exploring the various regions that produce the variety of wines that come from this part of the world and/or engaging with experts and practitioners of viticulture: the study and practice of cultivating grapevines. And of course, there's plenty of experiential learning opportunities (i.e. wine tastings) to expand your knowledge of enology, the study of wine and wine making. The Winelands are home to 24 red grape varieties and 22 white grape varieties; so be prepared for extensive class participation.

THE HISTORY OF SOUTH AFRICA'S WINE INDUSTRY

South Africa's first vineyards were planted by 17th century Dutch settlers by way of the Dutch East India Company. The early days were

challenging. Dutch farmers lacked viticultural knowledge and winemaking expertise at that time because their flat and wet homeland wasn't suitable for wine production. Between 1680 and 1690, French Huguenot immigrants arrived, bringing generational winemaking knowledge and skills from wine producing regions in France—including Champagne, Poitou and Orleans. The wine industry began to thrive in the first half of the 19th century, with the number of vineyards growing substantially, and wine production increasing. Despite subsequent challenges and difficulties in the wine industry (wars, overproduction, disease and shortage of materials) South Africa has a significant history and deep connection to the world of winemaking. Today, the country has transitioned from a dominant co-op-driven industry to a diversified and quality-focused wine market. In the mid-1990s, South African wines began to make their mark on the global stage, and smaller boutique wineries started to gain prominence, emphasizing the unique characteristics of their vineyards. These developments are shaping an exciting future for South African wines.

Constantia Glen is a picturesque boutique wine estate of 60 hectares that produces award-winning, cool climate wines. The magnificently appointed wine estate on the upper reaches of the Constantiaberg, is one of the jewels of the Constantia Valley and home of South African wine with a proud winemaking history dating back to 1685. The Tasting Room at Constantia Glen offers an amazing wine tasting experience that can be accompanied by delicious platters or a main course. An upscale restaurant, with one of Cape Town's best views, uses the freshest, highest-quality ingredients from sustainable sources and offers delicious platters, salads, soups, mouth-watering gourmet mains and yummy desserts.



You'll visit five of South Africa's wine producing areas in the Winelands to explore the land, culture and history of where South Africa's varieties of grapes are grown, then transformed into to the region's award-winning vintages. In July 2024, The International Wine and Spirit Competition judging took place in Stellenbosch. More than 500 entries were judged, resulting in the award of 520 medals; including 36 gold medal winners. During that same month and year, The Global Syrah Masters Competition, awarded the South African entry with its prestigious "Master Medal" at its competition in London – outperforming entries from France! Your visits to these wine regions include:







STELLENBOSCH

The scenic Stellenbosch Wine Route is the oldest in the country. The historic town for which the route is named, is a city where every street and building speaks to the people and events that settled this town with its vibrant street culture.

PAARL

The largest town in the Cape Winelands; Paarl is the second oldest settlement in the Winelands. Paarl produces award-winning, rich red and crisp white wines. The name in Dutch means "a pearl" and was derived from the fact that the granite rocks that crown the hillside above it glisten like pearls and diamonds after a rainfall.

CONSTANTIA

Located in the southern suburbs of Cape Town; this region is best known for its Chardonnay wines.

ROBERTSON

With its proximity to the Indian Ocean this region produces rich and intense wines.

FRANSCHHOEK

Located in the beautiful valley enclosed by the towering Klein Drakenstein and Wemmrschock mountains, where chardonnay and pinot noir wines are the pride and joy of this town that became the enclave of French Huguenot immigrants in 1688. It's also where you'll visit the first 100% Black-owned winery in the region, Klein Goederust.


UNIVERSITY OF STELLENBOSCH



The University of Stellenbosch is the oldest university in South Africa. Originally named Victoria College, the university dates back to the 17th century. Training in Viticulture and Oenology Sciences dates back to the 1880s. In 1995, these two departments became the Institute for Wine Biotechnology (IWBT). As the South African Wine Industry grew, the IWBT evolved as well. IWBT began offering post-graduate studies in winemaking, with a more intense focus on research. The South African Grape and Wine Research Institute at

Stellenbosch University was established to ensure that the academia, funding, faculty and post-graduate applicants admitted, met the standards required of a world-class research institute. Stellenbosch is the only university in South Africa that offers undergraduate and post-graduate studies in the viticulture and oenology sciences.

VINEYARD LABORERS HOUSING



South Africa is the world's largest producer of Fairtrade wine. As of 2024, there are 43 Fairtrade wine producing vineyards in South Africa; 29 were established during the year. While wages vary by regions; whether or not a winery provides housing for its laborers is the greatest determining factor in wages paid. Though politics and freedoms for Black people have changed since apartheid, living and working conditions for farm laborers and dwellers have not kept pace with postapartheid progress- despite the assurances of Fairtrade


accreditations. Your tour will provide an up close and personal look at where the many of the laborers in the region call home and raise their families.

SEVEN SISTERS WINE ESTATE TOUR AND TASTING



The Seven Sisters wine brand was started in 2005 by Vivian Kleynhans in an effort to change the destiny and build a legacy for her family. The seven Brutus sisters and their brother grew up in a disadvantaged community on the outskirts of Cape Town. Their father lost his job and they were evicted from their home but always yearned to return. Twenty years later, they reunited to create fine wines. Seven Sisters Vineyards operates as one of the few black female owned

wineries in South Africa. Their wines are cultivated in their very own vineyard and are named after the style and personality of each sibling. Seven Sisters Wines has achieved great success in markets around the world, including China, Nigeria, the United Kingdom, Scandinavia; and within the United States, the wines are sold in Walmart stores.



Klein Goederust is the first winery owned by a Black person in the Winelands. Paul Siguqa, a farm laborer's son turned wine baron purchased this winery in 2019; making it the first 100% Black-owned winery in the valley. His mother Nommaroma Siguqa worked in the vineyards for 30 years and was one of the very few laborers promoted from the fields to the wine cellars. To stay true to his cultural heritage but also honor Klein Goederust's history, Mr. Siguqa retained the farm's name (which dates back to 1905) but added his Xhosa identity by adding his clan/family crest to the vineyard's logo. Mr. Siguqa's winery has received a 4.5 out of 5.0 rating from Trip Advisor (individual and tour company reviewers).
